The Alburnett City Council met in regular session on **Thursday April 12, 2012** at the Alburnett Fire Station Office. Mayor Boesenberg called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM with council members Titler, Lawrence, Schantz and Trumm present. Other present were Mark Dierks, Marcia Rudd, Chad Sands, John Harris, Joe Horaney, David Haugen, Nancy Wieland, Brad Brownell, Deputy Hughes and Steve Graham.

Motion to approve the consent agenda was moved by Trumm, second by Titler. Motion carried.

Nancy Wieland requested to use the alley north of Mike's on Saturday April 14<sup>th</sup> for the Angie Kuehl Benefit. Motion to close the alley from noon Saturday until noon Sunday was moved by Schantz, second by Lawrence. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the annual carrier-haulers permit with Rudd Sanitation was moved by Titler, second by Schantz. Motion carried.

Mark Dierks spoke on behalf of the Booster Club about running a larger water line to the concession stand and baseball diamond. The Booster Club will pay the cost of running the line and the larger water meter but asked the City to waive the hook up fee. Motion to waive the hook up fee provided the Booster Club incurred all costs and had all the work inspected by MSA was moved by Schantz, second by Lawrence. Ayes – Schantz, Lawrence, Trumm. Nay – 0. Abstain – Titler. Motion carried.

Sheriff's Report – Deputy Hughes handed out call for service log sheets. Required hours are 43.0 and there were 111.0 hours of service last month. Deputy Hughes reminded everyone present that it is illegal to walk on the railroad tracks.

Joe Horaney, Linn County Solid Waste Agency, spoke about services available to Linn County Residents. The Solid Waste Agency at 1954 County Home Road accepts appliances, bikes, tires and scrap metal; it also offers drive thru recycling, The Pollution Prevention Center Swap Shop in addition to the landfill.

Dave Haugen, MSA Professionals, met with DNR representatives on Thursday April 12 for a final walk thru on the water project. There were no questions or comments so the water project is now complete. The light on the water tower has been replaced and that will bring the water tower painting to a close. Municipal Pipe has two more services to grout and that should be completed next week. Alburnett was not chosen to receive money from the Housing Rehabilitation Program.

Chad Sands, ECICOG, reviewed changes to the City Ordinances suggested by the City attorney. A public hearing for codification of the city codes is set for May 10 at 7:00 PM.

Motion to have ECICOG do a comprehensive plan for the City, not to exceed \$7,187.00, was moved by Trumm, second by Schantz. Aye – Trumm, Schantz, Lawrence, Titler. Nay – 0. Motion carried.

Fire Department Report – Steve Graham reported there were four medical calls in town, 3 mutual aid for grassfires, one medical call in the township and one car accident.

Brad Brownell, Kluesner Construction, presented a proposal for crack sealing some of the city streets. Council will review his suggested repairs and make a decision at the May council meeting.

Motion to approve the consent agenda with the addition of an invoice from Master's Auto for \$278.04 and an invoice from Batteries Plus for \$119.60 was moved by Lawrence, second by Schantz. Motion carried.
