The Alburnett City Council met in regular session **Thursday October 14, 2010** at 7:00 PM in the Alburnett Fire Station Office. Mayor Boesenberg called the meeting to order with council members Lawrence, Schantz and Trumm present. Titler arrived at 7:05 PM. Others present were Don Hoskins, David Haugen, Jay Pearson, Ray Possehl, Gary Kapman, Joan McCalmant, Tina Smith, Deputy Brady and Sharon Gonzalez.

Motion to approve the agenda was moved by Schantz, second by Trumm. Motion carried.

Sheriff's Report – Deputy Brady presented the monthly call report. There were 72.54 hours of service last month.

Joan McCalmant, Linn County Recorder, introduced herself and asked if there were any questions or concerns.

Sharon Gonzalez, Deputy Treasurer, gave a history of her experience in office and why she is running for Linn County Treasurer.

Tina Smith has volunteered to organize a celebration for Alburnett's centennial in the year 2012. Tina was looking for ideas and support for the celebration.

Motion to open the public hearing for sanitary sewer improvements and rate structure was moved by Schantz, second by Trumm. Ayes – Titler, Lawrence, Trumm and Schantz. Nays – none

Dave Haugen, MSA Professional, explained the problems we have had with rain water infiltration into the sewer system. We have had to bypass several times in the last couple of years. This is costly and could result in penalties from the DNR. Sewer pipes have been televised and the most damaged pipes have been identified. The city is planning to line portions of the sanitary sewer with a plastic liner to reduce infiltration. The cost estimate for lining 3634 feet of sewer is \$450,000.00. We will be applying for a CDBG Grant and a SRF Loan to help finance this project. We will be get bids for the project in the spring. Motion to close the public hearing was moved by Schantz, second by Titler. Ayes – Trumm, Schantz, Lawrence, Titler. Nays – none

Motion to open regular council meeting was moved by Trumm, second by Titler. Motion carried.

Fire Department Report – There were 13 calls total for the month: 4 medical calls in the township, 3 medical calls in town, 1 fire in the township, 2 football standby, 1 motorcycle accident and 2 public relations.

Dave Haugen, MSA Projects, gave an update on the water projects. The computer controls will be installed in the new well house on Oct. 18th with chlorination beginning Oct. 19 or 20. The looping of the water main from North Street to Strong Drive will be completed this fall.

MSA recommended the City pay Rathje Construction \$13,399.20 for work completed on the water project. Motion to approve pay application #4 to Rathje Construction for \$13,399.20 was moved by Trumm, second by Schantz. Ayes – Lawrence, Titler, Trumm, Schantz. Nays – none

MSA recommended the City pay Bockenstedt Excavating \$94,857.50 for work completed on the water project. Motion to approve pay application #5 to Bockenstedt Excavating for \$94,857.50 was moved by Titler, second by Lawrence. Ayes – Trumm, Lawrence, Titler, Schantz. Nays – none

Motion to approve the consent agenda was moved by Lawrence, second by Trumm. Motion carried.
